Microbeads
Microbeads are minuscule pieces of plastic you find in exfoliating soaps. They don't dissolve, so when you wash them away, they end up in the sea.

Wet wipes
Wet wipes cause all kinds of problems. They're made with plastic that doesn't break down like paper wipes. So if you flush them down the toilet, they can block the sewers.



Single use plastics
Not all plastic is recyclable. So, even if you recycle your household cleaner bottles, the lid will probably end up in landfill, or need to be incinerated.

Antibacterial soap
We all want our homes to be clean and hygienic. But a lot of anti-bacterial soaps contain triclosan. It's good for killing germs but can be harmful to humans.



Laundry detergents
Laundry detergents often contain phosphates. These act like fertiliser when they get into the water supply, causing plants to grow and choking the waterway.

Aerosol sprays
Cleaning products that come in an aerosol can may well contain hydrocarbons and nitrous oxide – two greenhouse gases.

Bleach
Made with lye and chlorine, bleach is highly corrosive. And when it gets out into our waterways it can create dangerous toxins that last for decades.
